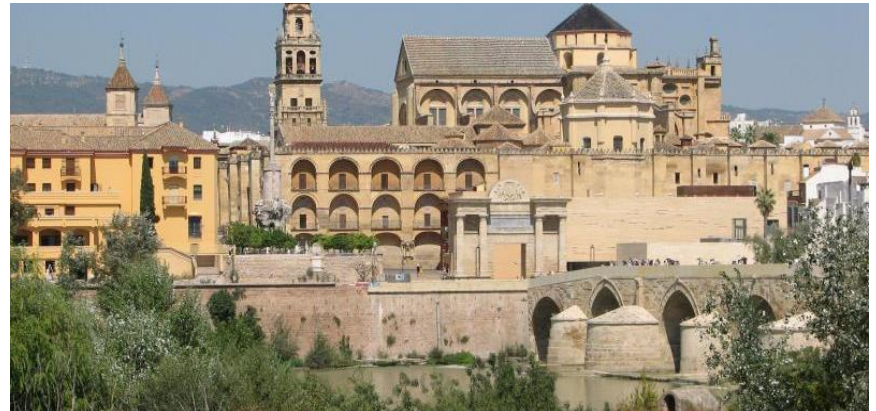


# The mixt of architectural styles
